It was noted that the Illuminated Address for Royal Air Force Leeming, held last summer, had been very successful event in the town. This was followed by an array of other annual events, including the increasingly popular bonfire celebrations and Bedale Christmas market. In the summer months, Bedale is delighted to host monthly Banquets, the annual Scouts and Guides Festival, dog shows, a fun fair and weekly car boot sales. Additionally this year, the Mayor hosted a highly successful afternoon tea event Bedale Hall, to raise funds for local organisations.

On behalf of the whole community, the Mayor thanked the many voluntary groups in Bedale including; Bedale Tourist Information Centre, Bedale Library, Bedale Museum, Bedale Hall, Meals on Wheels, Bedale Litter Busters and Volunteer Mini- bus. She expressed her sincere gratitude to the many dedicated volunteers for their ongoing service and commitment.

It was noted that new equipment has been installed in the play area at Southfield, and that work is carried out on a continuous basis, to maintain equipment and street furniture in order to uphold and enhance the appearance of Bedale town. Council members continue to work hard to maintain standards in the town and are greatly assisted by members of the community alerting the Town Council to their concerns. The Mayor also confirmed that Bedale Town Council will routinely lobby other councils on behalf of residents, to ensure their concerns are addressed.
